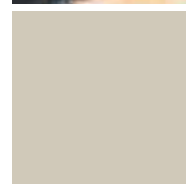
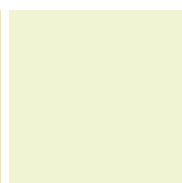

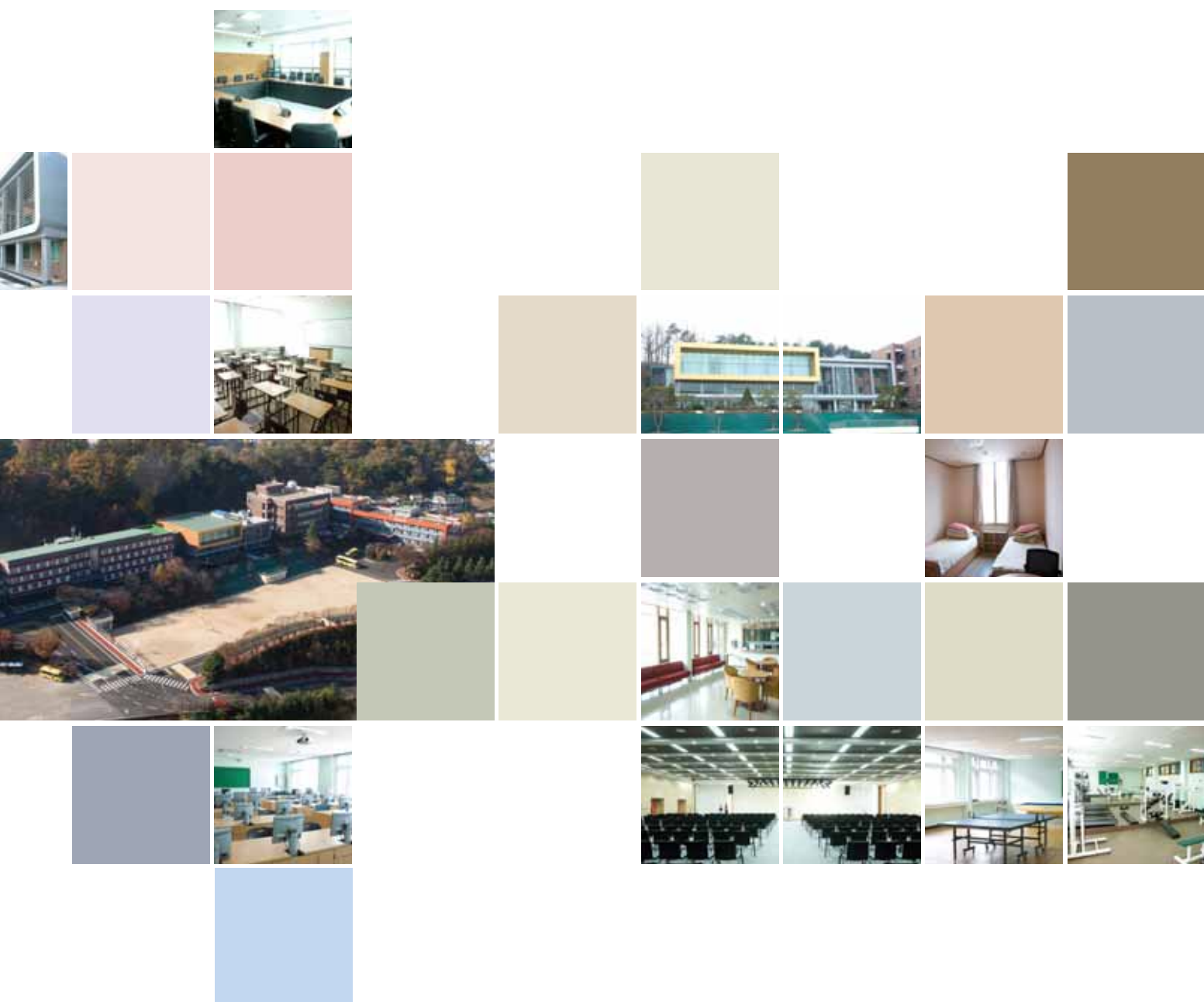

※ In case there are an excess in the number of dormitory days due to the use of the summer vacation period(July-August) for employment(qualification)prep course, and college admission prep course, dormitory expenses and food expenses are to be added.

※ In case of the failure to complete the relative course due to the circumstances such as abandonment of admission, and withdrawal from school, educational expenses are to be returned according to the internal guidelines for educational expenses return.

- ⑤ A Photocopy of a Passport
- ⑥ Student Study Plan(a prescribed form), 1 copy respectively.

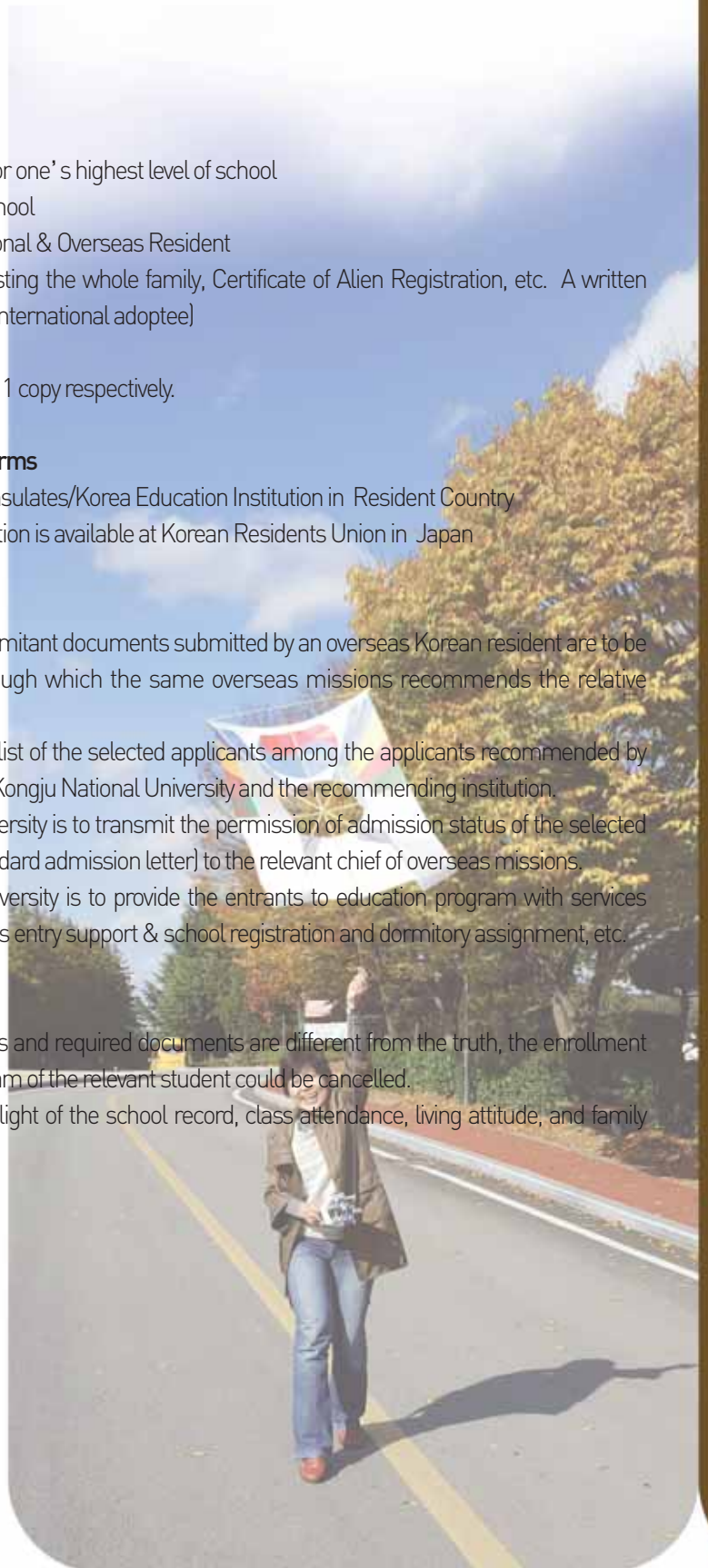

※ Nevertheless, In case of Japan, application is available at Korean Residents Union in Japan

## 8. Admission Process

- ① The application together with its concomitant documents submitted by an overseas Korean resident are to be reviewed by overseas missions, through which the same overseas missions recommends the relative applicant to NIIED
- ② The president of NIIED is to notify the list of the selected applicants among the applicants recommended by overseas missions to the president of Kongju National University and the recommending institution.
- ③ The president of Kongju National University is to transmit the permission of admission status of the selected applicants and invitation letters(or standard admission letter) to the relevant chief of overseas missions.
- ④ The president of Kongju National University is to provide the entrants to education program with services needed for practical admission, such as entry support & school registration and dormitory assignment, etc.

## ■ 9. Others

- When the entry contents in applications and required documents are different from the truth, the enrollment and completion of the education program of the relevant student could be cancelled.
- Scholarships are to be granted in the light of the school record, class attendance, living attitude, and family circumstances, etc.

# Admission & Registration

## 1. Entry

An expectant entering student is to inform his/her entry schedule to the person in charge of admission at Kongju National University; on arrival in Incheon International Airport on the day of entry, the student is to be guided by a school employee receiving a visitor to enter the dormitory after registering at the place of school registry. If a student fails to meet a school employee who comes for meeting, the relevant student is required to definitely to contact Kongju National University.

※ The day of entry is to be limited to the period of registration, so in case of advance entry, the relevant student is required to definitely inform the fact to the person in charge of admission of Kongju National University.

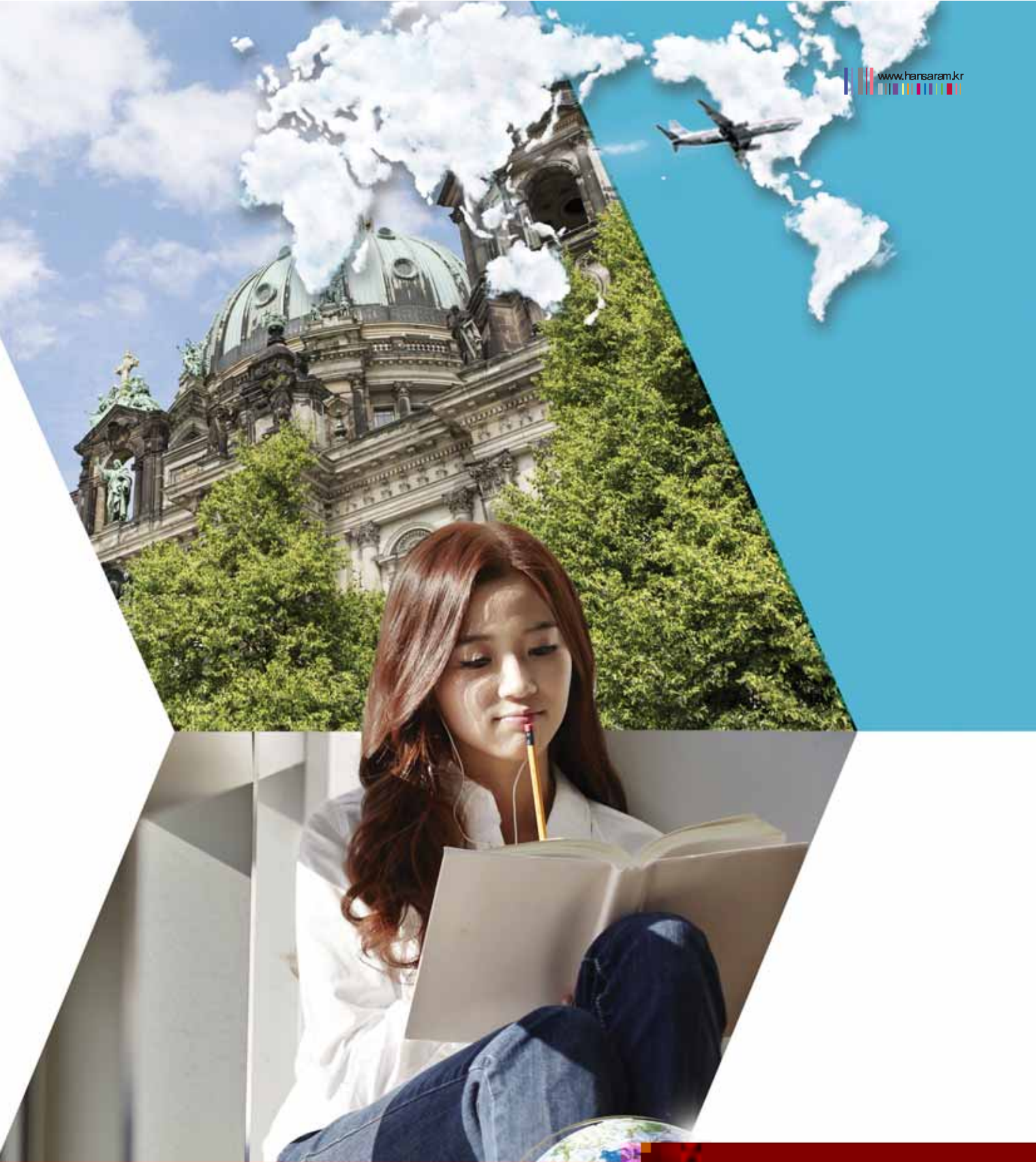
## 2. Registration

※ Also, an opportunity for industry field training is given to a student who acquired the test result equivalent to Grade-5 and above in TOPIK, and is equipped with practical business skills(related certificate of qualification, etc.) among the students taking the employment(qualification)prep course.

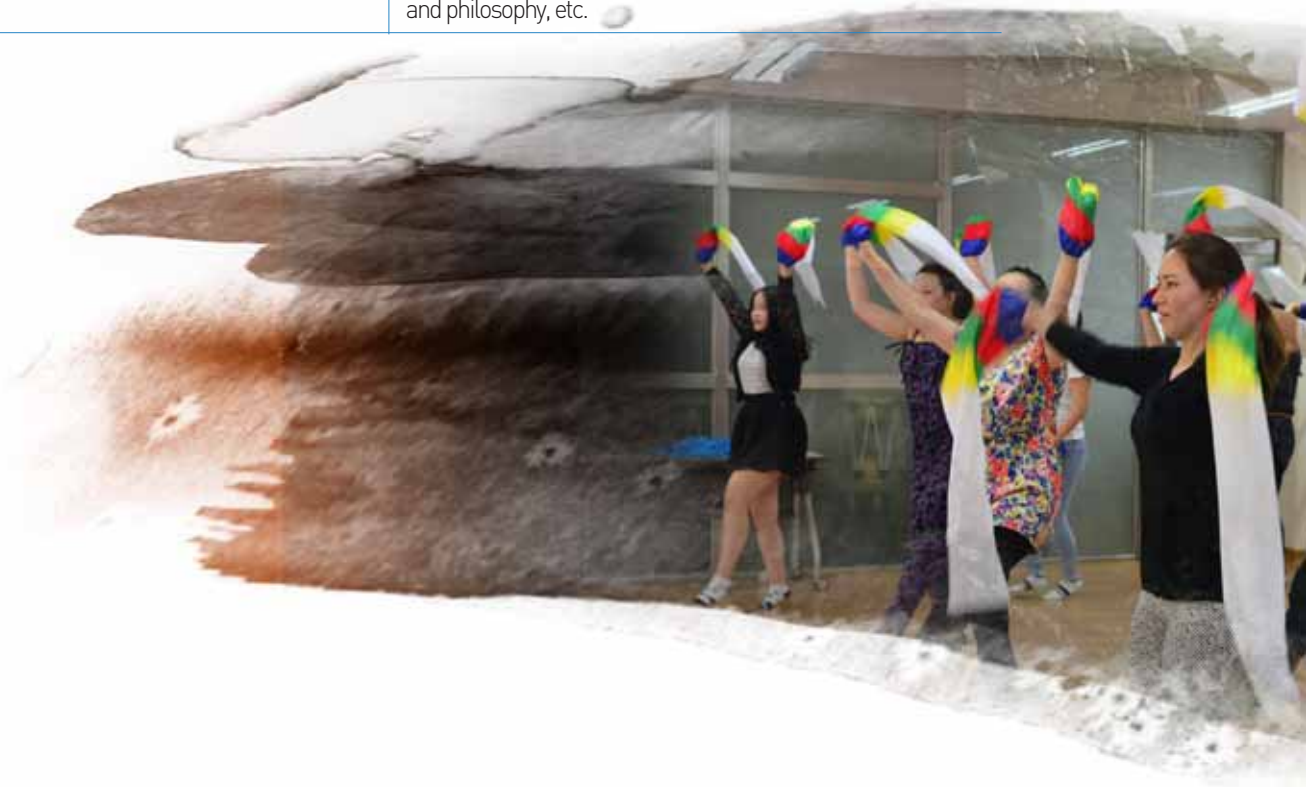

※ Nevertheless, in case a beneficiary of the national treasury scholarship and Institution of Korean Culture & Education Scholarship discontinues school work, or fails to meet the condition of program completion, the relevant committee can redeem the already benefited scholarship according to internal rules about scholarship management.

# Information about School Dorm and Living



## 1. Dormitory

- In case the students of the homeland education program for overseas Koreans, who received the permission of entrance, are, in principle, required to enter the dormitory of Kongju National University without exception.
- The students of the homeland education program for overseas Koreans are supposed to use the dormitory of the Institution of Korean Culture & Education in Kongju National University Okryong Campus, and they are to live with overseas Korean students from several countries in the world through dormitory living.
- In principle, the relevant students are to use the dorm on double occupancy basis, and the dormitory is to be managed through intra-floor distinction of sex.
- The school dormitory is a modern building equipped with air conditioning and heating, and it is furnished with various service facilities like break room, reading room, Internet lounge and laundry room, etc.
- Also, a living instructor resides in the dorm to control safety of trainees, ensuring safe dorm living of students of the homeland education program.
- Lodging at the dorm is available even during summer vacation(July~August), and lodging expenses and other details are to be guided separately.

Available for free use of the reading room for group study and self-study, etc.  
(Reading room hours: 06:00~24:00)



Students' Break Room

A space arranged for resting during one's free time and friendship promotion between trainees  
- Furnished articles: A Large HDTV, magazines, board game, microwave, cabinet, and chairs, etc.  
(Open Time: 06:00~24:00)



Internet Lounge

A space arranged for students to freely do information search and video-telephony, and so forth  
-Furnished articles: 10 units of desktops, 10 webcams, 10 headsets, 1 printer, and so on  
(Open Time: 06:00~24:00)

## 2. Visa

### - General Training Visa(D-4)

- In case the duration of the homeland education program is more than 6 months, the relevant student is required to obtain D-4 Visa.
- D-4 Visa application should be at the Korean Embassy or Consulate, and it takes at least 2~3 weeks until its issue.

### - Short-Term General Visa(C-3)

- In case the duration of the homeland education program is below 3 month, it's also possible to enter the country by obtaining C-3 Visa.
- C-3 Visa is valid for 3 months(90 days), and it is available to apply for it at the Korean Embassy or Consulate.
- In case of C-3 acquisition, the relevant student is required to enter Korea in keeping with the period of school registration.

### - Overseas Korean Visa (F-4)

- F-4 Visa is a multiple one, which is valid for 5 years with less than 2 years' sojourn, and it is possible to obtain this Visa in case overseas Koreans having foreign nationality are equipped with certain requirements.

### - No-Visa

- In case of a student from a country which concluded visa-waiver agreements with Korea, and whose period of the homeland education program is below 3 months, it's possible to receive the same program for 90 days without a visa.
